








Annotated Resource Set (ARS)

Contextual Paragraph for Resource Set: This is a resource set that addresses the seventh standard of the 11 th grade U.S. History II, Utah state core curriculum. The lessons are specific to the first objective and indicator (a) Analyze the factors that led to militarism and fascist aggression in the world. The primary sources in this set will help students understand the underlying causes of World War II and why it became a global crisis.

Notes/Comments: The first two links take you to exhibitions on propaganda World War II. Students will investigate these sources to gain information for the rise of dictatorships. The next links will take you to a site that gives detailed text on the Treaty of Versailles and fourteen points, students will look for evidence that Germany used to build up military and follow Hitler as a Fascist Dictatorship. The purpose is to show how the dealing with our First World War had extreme implications for causing the environment that led to the Second World War.
