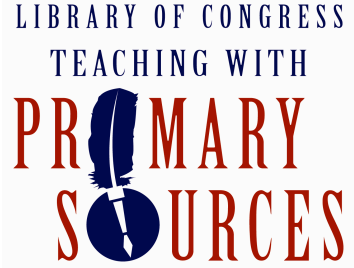






Annotated Resource Set (ARS)

Contextual Paragraph for Resource Set: This is a resource set that addresses the eighth standard of the 11 th grade U.S. History II, Utah state core curriculum. The lessons are specific to the second objective and indicator (c) Examine the various factors that drew the United States into conflict with North Vietnam and Ho Chi Minh. The primary sources in this set will lead students to examine the reasons why there was a conflict in Vietnam and the role that communism played in that conflict.

How was the United States drawn into conflict with North Vietnam and Ho Chi Minh?	<p>-Have students analyze the Vietnamese Declaration of Independence and the Gulf of Tonkin Resolution.</p> <p>-Use the document analysis form from NARA website link in the last column.</p> <p>Download the Kennedy recording from the resource set, as they listen make sure students write their observations and inferences from the recording.</p> <p>Have students read the information from the Vietnam map source.</p>	<p>-Have students write a Declaration of War Speech that would turn the conflict in Vietnam to an official declared war. They may choose to speak in the voice of Kennedy, Johnson or Eisenhower.
