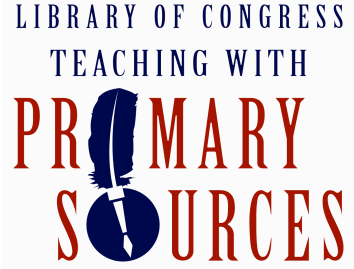

Each story is about some early person or group that came to Utah. Students will then write a short summary about the person or group and explain an important character trait possessed. Students will then give a short oral report. All students will listen and take notes about the important character traits.</p> <p>****I have included 16 stories. Some are actual pioneers, some are pioneers in their respective field.****</p>	<p>Each individual student will use the notes from the oral presentations to write a 5 paragraph essay.</p> <p>“What pioneer traits live on in Utah today.”</p>
