

| Contextual Paragraph for Resource Set: <p>The Louisiana Purchase in 1803 doubled the area of the United States adding the land between the Mississippi River and Rocky Mountains. Under the direction of President Thomas Jefferson, the Lewis and Clark Expedition was organized to explore this vast western expanse. Fulfilling Jefferson's dream, the Corps of Discovery would eventually reach the Pacific Ocean, bringing back a wealth of geographic and scientific information. An awareness of the events that led to the Louisiana Purchase, the lands explored, the people involved in its exploration, and the results of the expedition, are essential to understanding the westward expansion of the United States and the growth and development of the nation.</p> | | |

| 8 | Utah Social Studies Core Curriculum Geography History | U.S. History 1 Standard 1 Standard 7 | <p>Students will develop an understanding of the reasons for the Louisiana Purchase.</p> <p>Students will develop an understanding of the exploration of the Louisiana Purchase and western lands.</p> <p>Students will develop an understanding of the people involved in the Lewis and Clark Expedition and their contributions.</p> <p>Students will develop an understanding of the geographic, political, and scientific results of the Lewis and Clark Expedition.</p> <p>Students will develop an understanding of the impact of the Louisiana Purchase and its exploration on the United States and its westward expansion.</p> | <p>Students will identify the reasons for the Louisiana Purchase.</p> <p>Students will locate the United States, Louisiana Purchase, and western lands on a period map and identify important physical features.</p> <p>Students will locate the route of the Lewis and Clark Expedition and relate major events of the expedition.</p> <p>Students will investigate the people involved in the expedition and evaluate the contributions they made.</p> <p>Students will report on the contributions of people involved in the expedition.</p> <p>Students will formulate reasons why the Louisiana Purchase and Lewis and Clark Expedition were important to the westward expansion of the United States and its growth and development.</p> | <p>Watch PowerPoint presentation on events leading to the Louisiana Purchase and discuss reasons for its purchase.</p> <p>Have students locate the following on a period map: a. United States b. Louisiana Purchase c. Western lands d. Important physical features</p> <p>Watch PowerPoint presentation on the Lewis and Clark Expedition.</p> <p>Have students locate the route of the Lewis and Clark Expedition on a map and discuss the major events of the expedition. Map: http://www.nationalgeographic.com/expeditions/lessons/06/g35/challenges.html</p> <p>Divide students into four groups. Assign each group one of the following: a. Lewis and Clark b. The Men (Core of Discovery) c. Sacajawea d. Native American Tribes Assign students to investigate and evaluate the contributions of the person(s) or group to the expedition.</p> <p>Give each group a large piece of butcher paper. Have them write the name(s) of the person(s) or group they were assigned. Using drawing and writing have them report on at least five reasons why their group was most important to the expedition. After the reports, have the students summarize the reasons for the success of the expedition.</p> <p>Have students examine the map of the Lewis and Clark Expedition. Give students exit cards.
